You may receive Communion, even if you are not an Episcopalian. Our custom is to receive the bread in the hand and guide the base of the chalice when receiving the wine. Gluten-free wafers are available, so please ask for one when the priest comes to you.

The Hymnal 1982, is the blue book in the pew rack. Service music (*such as S 278*) is found in the front section of the hymnal.

Childcare is available from 9:45 am to noon. The nursery is in our undercroft. Ask an usher for directions.
