You may receive Communion, even if you are not an Episcopalian. Our custom is to receive the bread in the hand and guide the base of the chalice when receiving the wine. Gluten-free wafers are available, so please ask for one when the priest comes to you.

A video presentation by Dr. Peniel Joseph, Professor UT Austin. Peniel Joseph holds a joint professorship appointment at the LBJ School of Public Affairs and the History Department in the College of Liberal Arts at The University of Texas at Austin.

He is also the founding director of the LBJ School’s Center for the Study of Race and Democracy. His career focus has been on “Black Power Studies,” which encompasses interdisciplinary fields such as African studies, law and society, women’s and ethnic studies, and political science. Prior to joining the UT faculty, Joseph was a professor at Tufts University, where he founded the school’s Center for the Study of Race and Democracy to promote engaged research and scholarship focused on the ways issues of race and democracy affect people’s lives.
