
Church School Begins Sunday, September 12

FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I hope all of you are having a wonderful summer with some time for refreshment and recreation. Summer can be a holy time with opportunities to recalibrate and remember the importance of taking time out – Sabbath time that refreshes the soul as well as the body and mind.

While many of us have been taking a more leisurely pace this summer, some among us have been very busy. I think particularly of the Pilgrims who had a very successful pilgrimage to Ireland. From all reports it was a holy time for them, especially as they visited those “thin places” that are so much a part of the spiritual geography of Ireland. Nick’s article in this edition of the Window gives some insight into that experience. Expect to hear more about the pilgrimage early this fall.

The committee working on the Trinity Anniversary Cookbook has been very busy. Not only have they neared completion of the cookbook, they also have organized an extraordinary kitchen tour to help support the project. There has also been a lot of work done to advance the development of plans for a new Parish House facility. FROM THE ASSOCIATE

A Semi- Low Tech Pilgrimage

In my summer reading, a number of articles caught my attention, pieces with titles like “Wired and Unwired,” “Before Computers,” and “Hooked on Gadgets and Paying a Mental Price.” Each writer comments on the negative aspects of technology on our social fabric.

As part of our Youth Pilgrimage to Ireland, the mentors suggested (strongly!) that we not use iPods, cell phones, or computers. No phone calls. No private music. No texting. No email. No Web surfing. With surprisingly little resistance, the Pilgrims agreed to this arrangement. With a handful of exceptions (phone calls), none of the mentors used these devices, either.

In the end, there was general agreement that though hard and sometimes annoying, this experiment had been a good thing. In our “down” time, we conversed, read, wrote in our journals, listened together to the radio in the bus, were quiet, shopped, played cards, watched the World Cup, took walks and explored. In a word, we were more fully present to each other, ourselves, and our surroundings.

The practice of being present allows us to notice the stirrings of the Spirit of God in and around us. With less noise and distraction, internal and external, practicing that awareness is easier.

My prayer is that our Pilgrims had an enticing hint of that Spirit and her richness. We are so grateful to Trinity for this opportunity. **Come to our Adult Forums to learn more.**

Calling All Singers (and parents of young people!)

Weekly choir rehearsals for all three choirs begin on **Thursday, September 9**. Now is the best time for new singers to think about joining, as there are openings in all choirs. Call me in the music office, see me after church, or just come to the rehearsal.

Junior Choir (Gr. 2-3) Rehearses Thursday, 4:00-5:00 pm

The Junior Choir sings in the 10:00 am Eucharist Service on the first Sunday of the month when they are ready. Rehearsals are structured to acquire and develop basic skills in music and singing as well as to introduce the Hymnals and Book of Common Prayer and to learn about the Liturgy. No previous training or experience is required!

Youth Choir (Gr. 4-8) Rehearses Thursday, 5:15-6:15 pm

The Youth Choir participates every Sunday in the 10:00 am Eucharist singing an anthem on the first Sunday of each month and for special services at Christmas and Easter and other occasions. The Youth Choir also sings the Service of Choral Evensong twice each year. Rehearsals are designed around the Royal School of Church Music program teaching musical skills and singing technique in the context of our Liturgical tradition.

Parish Choir (HS & adults) Rehearses Thursday, 7:45-9:45 pm

The Parish Choir sings each Sunday in the 10:00 am Eucharist throughout the year. The Parish Choir also sings Choral Evensong three to four times each year and many special services at Christmas and Easter. The repertoire we sing is drawn from the wealth of traditional Choral styles ranging from pre-Reformation Europe to contemporary America. We have openings in all sections: Soprano, Alto Tenor and Bass!

Our Forum program resumes on September 12 with a new organizing principle. Each speaker will connect with one of **five themes—word, worship, wonder, world, witness**—each being an important aspect of our Christian life. This scheme was proposed by The Rev. Dr. Maureen Kemeza, one of Trinity’s Priest Associates, working with Nick in shaping our Adult Forum program.

A reminder to all who have care of small children—we have a professional childcare provider in the nursery beginning at 9am on Sundays, including summer. Emily Hansen is employed full-time at the highly regarded Infant-Toddler Center in Acton. At Trinity, she leads the care of children to age 4 with the help of a rotation of parent volunteers. September 12: 30 + years of Worship with the “New” Prayer Book: What’s Next?

The Book of Common Prayer has been an “identity marker” for Anglican Christians from the first—since 1549. But worship “by the book” has never stood still for long, and what direction—or directions—it will take next is an important part of the future of Anglicanism worldwide and the Episcopal Church in the USA. **The Rev. Dr. Charles Hefling** is professor of systematic theology at Boston College, and has been the Examining Chaplain for the Diocese of Massachusetts and Editor-in-Chief of the *Anglican Theological Review*. He edited *The Oxford Guide to the Book of Common Prayer*, and most recently *Catch the Vision: Celebrating a Century of the Order of Saint Anne*.

September 19: The Living Word: The Theological Landscape of Ireland

Celtic Christianity has long honored the environment as a “text” for communion with God. April Prewitt, Gaylord Brynolfson, and Nick Morris-Kliment were adult mentors for the Youth Pilgrimage to Ireland this past July. They will show slides and share their experiences of connection with God as mediated by the Irish landscape and Celtic Christian practices. Joining them will be the Rev. Dr. Maureen Kemeza, one of Trinity’s Priest Associates, who has been to Ireland many times.

September 26: A Journey Not a Destination: Theological and Psychological Perspectives on the Life of Faith and Wonder

Professor John McDargh has been on the theological faculty of Boston College since completing his doctorate in psychology of religion at Harvard thirty years ago. An Episcopal layperson and member of the vestry of St. Paul’s Newton Highlands, John teaches inter-disciplinary courses integrating developmental psychology and Christian spirituality. He is an Associate of the Society of St. John the Evangelist and has a practice of spiritual direction. John’s talk has been rescheduled from the spring.

Concord Kitchen Tour September 25 from 11 am to 3 pm



Cooking






