





THE FIRST LESSON

Exodus 3:1-15

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up." When the LORD saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

Then the LORD said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. The cry of the Israelites has now come to me; I have also seen how the Egyptians oppress them. So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" He said, "I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God on this mountain."



I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ. Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them, and they were struck down in the wilderness.

Now these things occurred as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not become idolaters as some of them did; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and they rose up to play." We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by serpents. And do not complain as some of them did, and were destroyed by the destroyer. These things happened to them to serve as an example, and they were written down to instruct us, on whom the ends of the ages have come. So if you think you are standing, watch out that you do not fall. No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.

PBS Airs 1974 Women's Ordination Film: "The Philadelphia Eleven"

Women were first ordained to the priesthood in the Episcopal Church in the United States in 1974--a momentous occasion in the history of the church. In 2023--almost 50 years later--a film called "The Philadelphia Eleven" was made about the "irregular ordination" of those women, the momentum that led to the service and the struggles and developments that followed--all the way to the 1988 election of Barbara Harris as Bishop of Massachusetts. This 90-minute film will be aired on PBS Channel 2 WGBH on March 30 at 6 pm. It is also already available for viewing both on **pbs.org** and the PBS app until June 2, 2025:

More than 50 years ago, this was the turning point for women's ordination to the priesthood. And there are **two Trinity connections** worthy of mention.

- 1) The fourth bishop involved in the laying on of hands was Rt. Rev. Tony Ramos, who had served as a seminary assistant here at Trinity in 1962 while studying at the Episcopal Theological Seminary in Cambridge and in 1974 was actively serving as Bishop of Costa Rica.
- 2) Charles V. Willie, who later became a member of Trinity Concord, delivered the sermon at the ordination service. And when the House of Bishops subsequently invalidated the ordination, Willie resigned his elected office of Vice President of the House of Deputies in protest.

Maundy Thursday is the day that commemorates the Washing of the Feet (Maundy) and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles, as described in the canonical gospels. This service includes The Holy Eucharist and The Stripping of the Altar.

Good Friday worship invites Christians to reflect on the suffering Christ went through for our sake by sacrificing his life for our sins. Reflecting on how much Christ suffered to pay for our sins deepens the joy and gratitude we feel for the gift of new life with Christ that we celebrate on Easter Sunday.
